Presidents Ponderings



Rotarians and Friends,

Do you know anyone who could be interested in assisting Rotary address the urgent need of child mortality throughout the world? This is the greatest challenge facing us.

Rotary International President D.K. Lee has made addressing child mortality the primary aim for his Presidential year.

Lee is quoted as saying "In every zone, in every district, more Rotarians are needed to help us reach our goal of saving children, because in every community there are children who need our help."

No wonder his theme for the year is "Make Dreams Real".

FACTSABOUT CHILD MORTALITY

- *More than one-third of all child deaths occur during the first 28 days of life.*
- *Up to half of the deaths under age five are associated with under nutrition.*

Other contributors to under five deaths are unsafe water, poor sanitation, and inadequate hygiene.

Only about 1 percent of under five deaths resulted from unknown causes.

Two-thirds of the under-five deaths are entirely preventable with such interventions as skilled attendants at delivery, newborn care, immunizations, oral rehydration therapy, antibiotics to fight pneumonia, and insecticide treated-mosquito nets(ITNs)

"Every day, in every part of the world, children die for the lack of a seatbelt or a smoke detector. Children die because they have nowhere safe to play. Children die because their parents cannot afford health care. Children die not because nobody can help them but because too often, nobody does."

The quotes are taken from the Rotary Foundation newsletter for September 2008.

As Rotarians, and even as friends of Rotary, it is our responsibility to ensure that people understand that Rotary is not just a gathering of business people for idle fun but that it is an organization dedicated to making a real difference for people in need in our local communities and overseas.

It is also an organization of ordinary people wanting to empower young and older people to create a better world for our children and our children's children too.

When more than 26,000 children die each day from preventable diseases such as pneumonia, measles, and malaria let's continue dreaming about what we can do to address these issues through local and overseas projects and let's see what we can do to bring more people into this great fellowship.

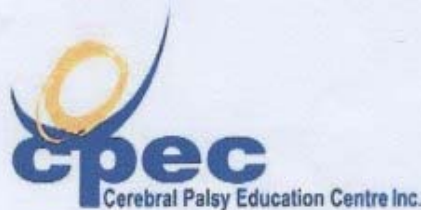

VOLUNTEERS FOR SUNDAY OCTOBER 12TH 2008

The Cerebral Palsy Education Centre (CPEC) has again been selected by IMG as the Official Charity of the Samsung Melbourne Marathon for 2008. Last year CPEC provided volunteers who managed the 16,000 runner's logistical requirements in and around the MCG. Our efforts are best summarized by the comments from Dallas O'Brien, the Samsung Melbourne Marathon Event Director, who wrote that, "*The biggest thank you should go to our official charity CPEC, true partners in every sense of the word in their support in providing over 170 volunteers at the MCG. Their professionalism and humble attitude was astounding ...*"

This year to maintain our status as the sole charity, one of the requirements was for CPEC to provide 250 volunteers. It is a big ask, and one that we now must deliver on. I am confident that with many of the families and friends from last year, and many new volunteers, we will achieve the required number and deliver the best managed event that is on IMG's events calendar.

The logistical tasks that we will again be managing are –

- Storage and tagging of the clothing for the 20,000 runners before and after the races
- Marshall's at the MCG to direct runners to their race starting points to start the races
- Marshall's for runners as they approach and enter the MCG
- Marshall's on the arena and at the finish line
- Marshall's for the First Aide station
- Marshall's to direct the runners to massage areas, back to collect clothing and into the stands to meet with their families and friends after the races.
- Marshall's away from the MCG for drink stand and runner directions.

General volunteers will be required to attend one evening event briefing a week before the event, arrive at 5.45am on event day for checking in at the MCG and to be on duty until 2.00pm. Lunch, snacks and drink packs are provided free for the day. It is a great community support day for the children, families and staff of CPEC.

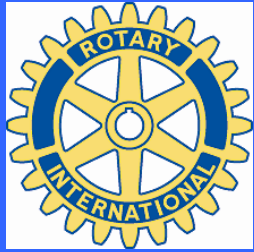

Re: Council on Legislation

The Council on Legislation, tentatively scheduled for April 25 – 30, 2010, will be the next opportunity for clubs and Districts to submit legislation to our Rotary “Parliament”.

Every three years Rotary International’s Council on Legislation meets to debate and vote on legislation submitted by clubs, districts and the RI Board. It is your opportunity to have a say and amend the way Rotary International operates. It would be excellent to see some wise legislation put forward by the clubs of this District. To find detailed information on how you may propose legislation use the following link:

Please keep in mind that all legislation, which is due at RI Headquarters no later than **December 31, 2008**, must be proposed or endorsed by District 9810.

You will appreciate that to be proposed or endorsed by District means proposed changes, **must be approved by all clubs prior to being submitted**. As we will not have a Conference, at which proposed legislation could be endorsed, prior to December 31, 2008, it will be necessary to circulate any proposed legislation to clubs for endorsement in a Ballot-by-mail.

After consultation with DG John Barnes, the following time frame, for proposed legislation to be submitted, will be effective in District 9810:

August 29: In my absence on holiday, PDG Jenny Coburn will deputise for me and give a presentation at DG John’s meeting with 2008-09 Presidents on Friday 29 August.

September 30: Proposed legislation to be with PDG Bob Richards (contact details above) for review

October 31: Proposed legislation circulated to all clubs in a Ballot-by-mail with time enough allowed for all clubs to clarify and discuss any proposed legislation in depth, and to ensure overlap with at least one Board meeting of each club

November 30: Ballot-by-mail closes and proposed legislation sent to Rotary International allowing plenty of time due to the busy Christmas mail period.

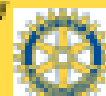

The project helps youth to build go-karts under the supervision of Cummins Diesel. They are all set up to go but need a premise where the karts can be assembled and stored over a three month period.

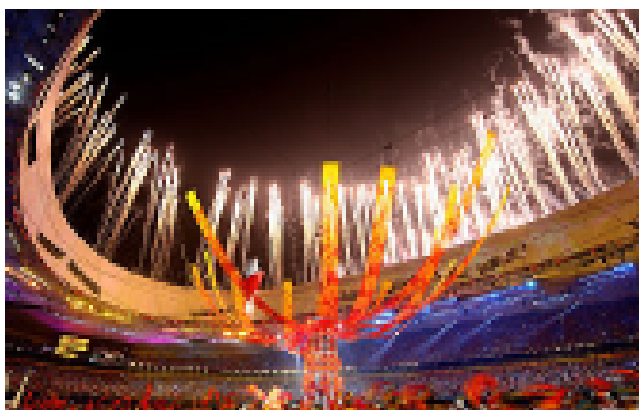
This worthwhile project is also seeking funds of some \$5000. Perhaps some clubs could pool resources to help out!
