Pam married in 1962 and moved to Tunstall Square where there were 4 shops surrounded by orchards. She quickly became a volunteer of the inaugural Tunstall Square Kindergarten building committee.

When her two daughters Margaret and Karen joined in school and community activities, Pam became a volunteer on school and church committees.

Pam is a Level 1 Calisthenic coach and established the Tunstall Square Calisthenic Club in 1968. This club ran for 35 years under her guidance connecting with 1,200 families. She also volunteered her time integrating disabled students into mainstream school as well as conducting women's exercise classes

Pam has spent the last 13 years as a volunteer in the administration of coach education with the Victorian Calisthenic Coaches Association. She is a life member of the Australian Calisthenic Federation and is currently the Victorian Country Liaison administrator.

Pam is a foundation member of Donvale Tunstall Probus and a Past President. It was there that she met her husband Malcolm in 2002.

Her call to Eastern Emergency was 5 years earlier when her husband died in 1997.

An avid supporter of volunteering, Pam now spends time in her retirement promoting a greater awareness in the community of the Eastern Emergency Relief Network and the disadvantaged people in our society.


There are 51 Rotary clubs in our District ranging in size from small clubs of 15 members in country communities, to metropolitan clubs with over 60 members.


